

## KENT COUNTY CRICKET CLUB - GROUND REGULATIONS

1. Matches are played in adherence to the rules and regulations of the England & Wales Cricket Board (ECB).
2. Play cannot be guaranteed on any day.
3. In the event of little or no play on any day, conditions on the reverse of the match day ticket will apply.
4. All cars on Kent County Cricket Club grounds are parked at the owner's risk and parking cannot be guaranteed.
5. Spectators do not have the right to choose where they park and windscreens must be covered at all times when sun reflection could interfere with play. Cars must adhere to 5mph speed restrictions at all times.
6. The Club may shut areas of the ground, stands and admission gates from time to time.
7. All persons entering the ground shall have either paid for admission and have received an appropriate ticket, or be in possession of a valid membership pass or other pass issued either by the Club or the ECB. Children under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult.
8. Admission and the right to remain within the ground is strictly on condition that spectators shall not commit any of the following acts:-
  - a) Failing to comply with directions given by a steward, police officer or Kent County Cricket Club official
  - b) Going onto the playing area during play or when requested not to do so
  - c) Throwing or discharging missiles of any description. Hard balls are not allowed on the ground
  - d) Obstructing an access route, or climbing on any building, wall or fence
  - e) Defacing any notice on Club premises or writing any graffiti or causing damage to Club property
  - f) Selling any items on the ground without the prior permission of the Club
  - g) Interfering with the enjoyment or safety of other spectators – radios may only be used with ear pieces or headphones
  - h) Using indecent or offensive language. The making of racially abusive comments and/or actions will not be tolerated and will result in immediate ejection from the ground and possible further action
  - i) Bringing barbeques, gas cylinders, large flags, banners, missiles or weapons into the ground
  - j) No alcohol may be brought into the ground at One Day matches. At all other matches spectators may not bring excessive amounts of alcohol into the ground
  - k) Bringing pets into the ground that are not under the complete control of the owner – dogs to be kept on short leads and are not permitted in areas where hot or unpackaged food is served. Owners to be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs

l) Smoking is not allowed in the stands, seats, club shops, bars or restaurants – smoking is permitted in all other areas (ie areas behind seating areas, in car parks etc)

**THE POLICE, STEWARDS AND CLUB OFFICIALS HAVE THE RIGHT TO SEARCH INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR CARS, AND MAY REFUSE ADMISSION TO ANY PERSON AND REMOVE FROM THE GROUND ANYONE CONTRAVENING ANY OF THE ABOVE.**

9. The Club may close bars at any time and/or restrict the consumption of alcohol to individuals.

10. Spectators are asked to wear shirts or tee shirts at all times in covered stand areas..

11. The spreading of ashes can only take place after agreement with the Club.

12. The Club accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to property or injury to persons whilst on the Club's premises.

13. It is not permissible to add to the height of a seat on the ground by using any method which obstructs the view of those sat behind.

14. Reserving seats for people not on the ground is not within the spirit of fair play and spectators are therefore asked to show consideration for others in not booking more than one seat for this purpose. The Club reserves the right to remove any items 'reserving' such seats.

15. Any bags left unattended may be removed by stewards to a safe place.

16. The use of cameras, mobile phones, computers and other electronic equipment for the recording, transmission or communication of match details, statistics, images etc is not permitted other than with the appropriate accreditation.

Please note that the above conditions are subject to change at any time at the discretion of Kent County Cricket Club and where Health and Safety legislation deems it to be necessary.
